Did you know?

Facts about Women in Administration

- Within Fortune 500 corporate boards seats, women held only 15.2% despite holding over half of the managerial positions.
- 25.5% of CEO positions in all types of business are held by women.
- Only 12% of hospital CEO positions are held by women even though they comprise 75% of the healthcare workforce.
- Women achieve CEO positions at 63% of the male rate.
- Compared to women in general business earning 27% less than men, women in healthcare are earning 18% less.
